THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading – Acts 10 vv 44 - 48

While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, 'Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?' So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.

At the end the reader may say

This is the word of the Lord.

All Thanks be to God.

New Testament Reading – 1 John 5 vv 1 - 6

Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the parent loves the child. By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. For the love of God is this, that we obey his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whatever is born of God conquers the world. And this is the victory that conquers the world, our faith. Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?

This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth.

At the end the reader may say

This is the word of the Lord.

All Thanks be to God.

Gospel Reading – John 15 vv 9 - 17

Alleluia, Alleluia.

I am the first and the last, says the Lord, and the living one; I was dead, and behold I am alive for evermore.

All Alleluia.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.

The Creed

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross.

Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with the Blessed Virgin Mary, Hilda and all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.

We hope that gutter lining will be finished this week (TBC).


Thank you all for your patience while this work has been going on. Whilst it isn't quite finished, the project has been very smooth to date and the contractors very supportive. Paula Gething

Linda Marshall (Christian Aid Local Rep for Staines & Laleham) writes:

"Christian Aid Week is just around the corner - the 67th since the first one in 1957 - and Christian Aid are encouraging us to do a 70k sponsored run, walk, swim, during May to raise money for their vital work. One of the pictures they have used in their publicity for this was taken last year outside St Mary's church in Staines when a few of us were setting off for a 10k sponsored wander around Staines & Laleham, so all we need this year is for groups of seven walkers to register for the Staines Stroll and we'll be all set to join in the challenge. Last year we raised just over £2,000 but now we are famous we could surely aim for twice that amount!

The walk will start between 9.00 and 9.30am from St Mary's on Saturday 11th May and go round 8 churches in Staines and Laleham, some of them open for a toilet break and refreshments, others for a rest and a look round the building. We hope this will be a time for members of all ages, from different churches, to meet each other in a relaxed (but energetic!) context."
