Together, let's aim to cover every corner of our community with prayer, ensuring no place or person is left untouched by God's love.

If you are unable to walk due to age or health, please know you are a vital part of this journey. Stand in your garden, by your doorstep, or at a window, and pray as you face different directions. Let your prayers join the chorus of intercession as others walk.

This Lent, let's commit to walking and praying together. Let's saturate our parish with love, hope, and faith—trusting that God will move powerfully among us as we journey with Him.

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
