THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

Old Testament Reading - Genesis 17 vv 1 - 7, 15 - 16

When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the Lord appeared to Abram, and said to him, 'I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless. And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will make you exceedingly numerous.' Then Abram fell on his face; and God said to him, 'As for me, this is my covenant with you: You shall be the ancestor of a multitude of nations. No longer shall your name be Abram, but your name shall be Abraham; for I have made you the ancestor of a multitude of nations. I will make you exceedingly fruitful; and I will make nations of you, and kings shall come from you. I will establish my covenant between me and you, and your offspring after you throughout their generations, for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and to your offspring after you.

God said to Abraham, 'As for Sarai your wife, you shall not call her Sarai, but Sarah shall be her name. I will bless her, and moreover I will give you a son by her. I will bless her, and she shall give rise to nations; kings of peoples shall come from her.'

At the end the reader may say

This is the word of the Lord.

All Thanks be to God.

New Testament Reading - Romans 4 vv 13 - 25

For the promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation.

For this reason it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (for he is the father of all of us, as it is written, 'I have made you the father of many nations')—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. Hoping against hope, he believed that he would become 'the father of many nations', according to what was said, 'So numerous shall your descendants be.' He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was already as good as dead (for he was about a hundred years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah's womb. No distrust made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, being fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised. Therefore his faith 'was reckoned to him as righteousness.' Now the words, 'it was reckoned to him', were written not for his sake alone, but for ours also. It will be reckoned to us who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead, who was handed over to death for our trespasses and was raised for our justification.

At the end the reader may say

This is the word of the Lord.

Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, 'Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things.'

He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, 'If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels.'

Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness; grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit, and according to your holy will, these gifts of bread and wine may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ; who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: *Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.*

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Great is the mystery of faith :

All Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again. And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world;

rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming in glory,

we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Stewardship Month and Parish Giving

As you have heard throughout this month, we are encouraging everyone who can donate regularly to St. Hilda's to do it through the Parish Giving scheme. Thank you to all who were already doing this, or who have recently moved to it.

The Planned Giving Co-ordinator from the Parish of Morpeth says: "The PGS has had the greatest effect on cash flow, as Gift Aid is recovered monthly instead of twice a year. The administrative load on myself and the Gift Aid secretary has been reduced by half, which has helped enormously, and the treasurer finds the monthly reporting invaluable."

This is the effect we would like for St. Hilda's, especially as we are currently without a permanent Treasurer.

One of our congregation who wanted to change their donation through Parish Giving said that it was really easy: just a single phone call and it was all arranged.

There will be someone at the back of church after each service in February to deal with any questions or concerns about PGS or any other aspects of stewardship.

Stewardship - Time and Talents

Would you like to do more to support our family of St. Hilda? There are lots of opportunities requiring anything from a few minutes to many hours of your time. Training is given if required. Some of them are:

Altar Server: some extra time before and after the service on duty days.

Sunday refreshments: more extra time before and after the service on duty days.

Wednesday refreshments: 10:30am - 1pm on duty days.

Leading the intercessions: preparation time at your convenience every few weeks.

Reading a lesson in church: a few minutes preparation time. A microphone can be brought to you if you cannot get to the lectern.

Open and close the church on a week day: travel time plus a few minutes morning and early evening on duty days.

Cleaning: need ability to use a vacuum cleaner for about an hour once a week or fortnight.

Gardening: whenever you feel inclined! Tools can be provided.

Technical Support: ad hoc; to support the live stream of the Sunday morning service and updating the church web site.

Chorister: need ability to sing in tune. The ability to read music is helpful but not essential. Practice Friday evening 7 - 8ish, on duty Sunday mornings and festival services - except during August.

Treasurer: need to be numerate and computer-literate. Several hours a month mostly at times of your choosing. Needed as soon as possible, but by APCM (28th April) at the latest.

Church Warden: need to be a responsible, organised leader. Several hours a week. Needed as soon as possible, but by APCM (28th April) at the latest - Paula needs help!

Ask any member of the PCC for more details, or about other ways of helping.

And if you can do none of these, **prayer** is always needed.
